Item 4 - Electoral Roll 2024 report

More Morning Prayer services are being requested and it is hoped to expand these as the weather becomes warmer. Thank you to all the churchwardens and DCC members who voluntarily give up their time to keep our churches open and welcoming.

Every church managed to pledge some money towards the Parish Pledge, though with many churches struggling to pay for repairs, the amount was understandably lower than usual. Thank you to Jem for continuing as our Parish Treasurer in these uncertain times.

With visiting priests, we have managed to ensure that parishioners can receive Communion each week, with members of the Ministry Team leading Family services and Morning Prayer.

My thanks to the Ministry Team for continuing to organise and lead services as we wait for some news from the Diocese about a new priest in our parish.

Item 13 - Work with children and young people

Toddler Group - Rosie Lynch gave an update in the report for the APCM last year advising "UPDATE It is with some sadness that I have to report that Carol Toft and I will no longer be running the South Lafford Toddler group. Our last session will be on Friday 26th May 2023. We are in the process of negotiating with a new leader who I hope will continue with the running of South Lafford Toddler group along the same lines, with a commitment to St Andrew's Church in Folkingham. More details to follow."

Item 5 - Annual Report around the Parish 2024

LAY VICE CHAIR'S REPORT FOR JANUARY - DECEMBER 2024

This is my last report to the parish as we welcomed Reverend Rebecca as our priest-in-charge in November 2024.

Our Christmas services around the parish had led us all to a joyful start to the year. The slight damper in December had been that we were told that we could no longer use the Parish Office in the Rectory so we had to move everything across to the only dry space large enough - the lower vestry in Folkingham church. Many thanks to all those who helped to move just before Lent and to St Andrew's DCC for agreeing to allow us to store all the items.

The Ministry Team led a successful Lent course on the Beatitudes, and the combined choir performed "The Cross of Christ" on Palm Sunday in Folkingham and on Good Friday in Billingborough. Both services were well attended and appreciated, and my thanks go to Liz Hill and the choir for continuing to lead our worship.

In the middle of Lent a Confirmation service was held in St Andrew's church Billingborough led by Bishop Nicholas. Linda and Richard from Swarby and Roger from Aunsby were amongst the candidates at this uplifting service.

Bishop Nicholas visited us again in April at a combined meeting of South Lafford and Billingborough benefice to discuss a plan to pay for a priest, how long would our interregnum last and the Parish Share. The evening enabled us to put forward questions from all the villages which the Bishop answered candidly.

Fun@4 held a Father's Day service in June and we're very grateful to Rosie for continuing to arrange services and encouraging our young people into church.

In July came the astonishing and very welcome news that we were to have a new priest. We were to join with the Billingborough Benefice and the new priest-in charge would have the task of creating a new parish. The Parish Profile was updated and with Billingborough's profile a combined one was drawn up ready for the candidates who might apply.

At the end of September, the interview took place in Edward King House with representatives from both parishes and members of the clergy.

Safeguarding C2 and Domestic Abuse Awareness training was held in September at a one-day course with Lucy Rowe, thus enabling everyone to update their responsibilities.

The Ministry Team led Harvest Festivals for all our churches which was greatly appreciated by the congregations.

At the beginning of October we joyfully announced that Reverend Rebecca Rock was to be our new Priest-in-charge and live in the newly refurbished Rectory along with her husband and daughter. Her installation service was held in a packed St Andrew's church Billingborough at the start of November.

Remembrance services were held in Folkingham, Pickworth and Osbournby and the year ended with Christmas services around the parish.

My heartfelt thanks to the Ministry Team, churchwardens, Alison and visiting priests for all your support and advice during our interregnum, as I hand over to Rebecca to start our new journey of change together.

Item 9 - Deanery Synod report

Deanery Synod Report for APCM

A lot of work was undertaken by the Deanery Synod' in 2024. 2025 saw the start of joint Synod meetings.

Lafford Deanery is now in partnership with Graffoe Deanery under the catchy name of the North Kesteven Deanery Partnership. The Deanery will be formed into three Local Mission Partnerships; Northwest, Northeast to which the North Lafford Benefice (which includes Ruskington) belong and South. Details on what these LMPs will offer is in the early stages of development.

Not yet with legal standing, the two Synods agreed convene joint meetings with the first on the 12^{th of} March this year. Bishop Nicholas was invited to speak and gave a very helpful and informative talk on "Growing Together" explaining the natural progression from a Time to Change Together. He informed us of his Episcopal Visitations due from May 2025, which were to focus on mission and what is happening for congregations and communities. He recognised the frustration around finance for priests in our Diocese but made the distinction that, apart from Norwich, Lincoln Diocese has the most churches across the country, many of which are small and very rural. No extra funding was available from grants for this area of ministry as compared to other Diocese and particularly large conurbations. He was encouraged that the two Deaneries had begun to work together, despite the legal process not yet being complete. Plans and dates for Joint Synods were outlined by the Partnership Dean Laura Brabin-Smith (who is also the Graffoe Rural Dean). She reiterated Bishop Nicholas's comment on Diocesan finances for the provision of parish priests and offered a short precis on how we might meet the challenges ahead through good leadership and willingness to collaborate. She reminded those gathered that the To Love and Serve the Lord foundation modules were being offered for those who wished to consider lay ministry or perhaps deepen understanding of their faith. Revd Philip Johnson, Rural Dean Lafford, gave an update on the existing motion which had been sent to the Diocese concerning the inequality of churches with open churchyards having to pay VAT on any maintenance costs, whereas with Local Parish Councils who maintain closed churchyards do not. He proposed to Synod that this motion be moved to Synod It was agreed with a wider vote of those from Graffoe Deanery. Note: This is to be proposed and voted on at
